

COVID-19 Operating Plan

Effective February 28, 2022

As the reopening of Arizona’s visitor industry continues, the Phoenix Convention Center (PCC) will observe 100% occupancy within its facilities (Phoenix Convention Center, Phoenix Symphony Hall, and Orpheum Theatre Phoenix). Event Organizers may hold in-person events at the PCC and Theatrical Venues with no capacity limits.

Event Organizers wishing to hold in-person meetings and events in PCC facilities shall adhere to the following COVID-19 safety protocols:

	Requirements for Indoor Gatherings Effective February 28, 2022
COVID Capacity Limitations	No restrictions.
Physical Distancing	No restrictions for fully vaccinated people within leased client event spaces. Unvaccinated individuals should continue to practice social distancing in accordance with CDC guidelines .
Temperature / Health Screenings	Temperature and health screenings while highly recommended will be at the discretion of the Event Organizer.
Face Coverings	In accordance with CDC guidelines , face coverings are recommended indoors for all individuals regardless of vaccination status. Face covering recommendations are determined by current COVID-19 community levels .
Proof of Vaccination Status/COVID Testing	Proof of vaccination, or a recent negative COVID-19 test, may be required for event attendees and/or staff at the discretion of the Event Organizer.

Our dedicated team continues to monitor and follow guidelines issued by local, state, and federal public health agencies. We are committed to working with Event Organizers, with a common goal of healthy and safe events in our facilities.
