




Circular Economy & Waste Diversion

Why it Matters

Events generate massive amounts of single-use materials. Our goal is to divert waste from the landfill and keep materials in use longer through reuse, donation, and recycling.





Zero Waste Event Execution

- Super Bowl LVII Experience reached
 92% diversion in 2023
- Final Four Fan Fest achieved a 94% waste diversion rate in 2024
- These results are driven by front- and back-of-house collaboration, clear signage, and client education



Reuseables & Material Recovery

- Reusable food service containers in the North Food Hall through our partner Bold Reuse
- 2,000 lbs of materials like signage, carpet, and décor repurposed in 2024
- Tote bags and planners created from upcycled street pole banners

Donation Opportunities

Food Recovery

Why it Matters

Food waste is one of the largest contributors to greenhouse gas emissions. At the same time, many in our community face food insecurity. We aim to bridge that gap.



Food Donation

- Over 56,000 lbs of packaged food and 11,000 lbs of prepared meals donated in 2024
- Our donation partnerships allow food that would otherwise be discarded to support local hunger relief efforts





Composting

- 68 tons of organic waste were composted in 2023 and 2024, keeping food scraps out of the landfill
- Our North Building Food Hall features front-of-house composting at all times
- Front-of-house composting bins are available upon request for events in any of our three buildings

How You Can Help

- Request leftover catered food be packaged for donation
- Choose compostable or reusable service ware and work with us to provide compost bins




Climate & Energy Efficiency


Why it Matters

Venues consume a significant amount of energy, especially when hosting thousands of guests. We've invested in upgrades to shrink our footprint while maintaining comfort and performance.



- Complete retrofit of all meeting rooms, halls, and common areas
- Recognized by the Department of Energy for energy efficiency leadership
- In 2024, this project resulted in \$560,000 and 3.8 million kWh in cost and energy savings







- Select events (Final Four, WNBA) powered through renewable energy via RECs
- Clients can work with us to explore renewable options for their event footprint

Biodiversity & Conservation

Why it Matters

We're in a desert city. Water is precious, and so is the local ecosystem. We prioritize practices that preserve both.



Monarch Butterfly Waystation

- Certified garden installed to support monarch migration and native pollinators
- Filled with drought-tolerant, nectar-rich plants that support local biodiversity



Xeriscaping

 Outdoor spaces and landscaping designed and maintained using waterconserving techniques like droughttolerant plants and minimal irrigation



How You Can Help

- Encourage attendees to use reusable bottles at our water refill stations across campus
- Minimize water usage in exhibits and encourage water-efficient practices beyond the PCC
